2,490 Sight opportunities made possible for children and adults in South Sudan



You may remember sometime ago, Kacce-Mae Donnelly, a 9 year old pupil at Our Lady's Primary School, Tullysaran asked for your help in collecting old eye glasses so they could be distributed to poorer children and adults around the world.

Well, we are delighted to let you know, that with your help we collected 2,490 pairs of glasses which have now been handed over to Fields of Life who will distribute

these glasses to their partners in Maridi and Ibba, Western Equatoria, South Sudan and some will also be delivered to the main hospital in the capital Juba. "We've contact with an Ophthalmologist who will ensure the glasses are the correct prescription for the recipients", added David Gough, International Development Manager, Fields of Life.
